7. <u>Treasurers Report and Accounts for Season 2021/22</u>(Jean Brackenridge)

I have shown 3 years accounts this year as its been a weird few years.

Couple of things to point out are:

There was no sponsorship for the Sussex Open this year as the 2020 amount of £120 wasn't used as the open was cancelled.

The amount for trophies doesn't include any individual trophies apart from singles, doubles, Sx Masters and off the spot as I had already bought trophies for 2020 and most things were cancelled or not completed. What I did was get new plates and engraving done on these and with the perpetual engraving the amount for this year was the cost of doing this. To get a true cost the amount for 2020 needs to be added to this year making approx. £1500.

I suggest the affiliation fee and inter league fees are kept the same next year. Im also going to make a suggestion about trophies but will do this under any other business for discussion.

On to the Sussex Open.

Again there is no sponsorship shown for this as 2020 was cancelled. Although we have a healthy balance this could quite quickly disappear. Entries are down in in all opens. In 2019 our entries were £900. Sponsorship cant be relied on.

I feel at the moment we are in a good position knowing we have enough to cover any losses for a few years but will be nice to try and maintain a the balance.

The accounts were accepted as a true record.

Dave Hampton asked why the account balance was high. There was discussion and it was decided the committee will look at it next year once we get a true record (after covid years) of the balance.

8. Home & Away Inter-League Report (Matt Knight)

Nice to see so many here in person at the end of a very challenging Inter-League season. A number of matches were called off with West Sussex only playing 2 matches before deciding to withdraw from Division 1 due to concerns over covid. They intend to re-enter next year, as I believe do all the other teams. I know there is an agenda item later in the AGM concerning formation of the Inter-League next season and there will be plenty of opinion on this matter for the committee to consider

Thank you to those teams who did manage to complete their fixtures especially Worthing B who also called a number of matches off but rearranged them and managed to get them played. Brighton B were also badly effected by their opponents calling off but with a great deal of hard work and flexibility got them arranged and played

I felt for Tunbridge Wells as both their matches against Redhill A (key matches in deciding the outcome of Division 1) were called off, the committee granted extra time for them to be arranged but it still meant both the matches were played without one of their regulars, through no fault of their own

It was challenging off the table but thrilling on the table with both divisions extremely close. In Division 1 Brighton A eventually prevailing. They had to sit and wait as they completed their matches but with results going the right way won by 2 points with 5 wins, very close for runner-up spot too with Brighton B, Redhill A and Tunbridge Wells all with 4 wins but the latter took second place due to a better leg difference

Division 2 even closer with Littlehampton pipping Worthing B to the title having both won 5 matches but a single leg proved the difference between the two teams. Redhill B and Lewes both won 4 matches to prove how close it was

Slightly off topic but thank you to everyone for their co-operation regarding the Sussex Masters especially the reserves who came in, a number of them at the last minute

Finally, I want to thank Stuart Carruthers for his hard work on the Sussex website especially where the league tables and stats are concerned for the Home and Away Interleague. I know everyone who uses the site appreciates it and the promptness of the updates

9. One Day Inter-League Report (Nigel Senior)
